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Ten professional librarians were invited to serve in the Education Committee during 1989/90.

Two main priorities were identified for 1989/90 by the Education Committee.

- 1. Critically review the education programme, especially the calibre of lecturers, teaching methodology and the syllabuses
- 2. Implementation of Fellowship Programme

<u>Constraints</u>

- * to limit travelling costs to lecturers- 6 lecturers to Kandy and 3 to Galle
- * to complete the missed lectures in Kandy at the Intermediate Level - 46 missed lectures were reported.
- * to find reasonable space to rent for Colombo lectures
- * to continue lectures during the prevailing unrest in the country
- * to uplift the low morale among the students

Counter Measures Taken

- * By re-distributing lectures among the Kandy lecturers and appointing new lecturers from Kandy the travelling costs have been reduced.
- * Missed lectures were covered prior to the examinations
- * Wesley College was chosen as a venue until access to the Institute of Aesthetic Studies is permitted
- * Time tables were constantly changed to cover the missed lectures due to transport difficulties
- * Student Representatives were appointed and Centre Co-ordinators were requested to liase with them

<u>New Initiatives</u>

* Mr Kapila Sirisena, Assistant Librarian, University of Ruhuna (Galle) and Mr Gunaratne Banda, Assistant Director, Sri Lanka National Library Services Board were appointed as the Co-ordinators for Galle and Colombo Centres respectively. The decision was taken by the Education Committee to give easy access for the students to forward grievances. J

32 applicants were invited for a briefing session. 19 turned up. Plans are underway to start the lectures from May 1990.

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Epilogue

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Even with prevailing unrest, lectures were conducted and courses were completed. Examinations at all $\underline{3}$ levels were held twice during 1989/90.

New Intermediate and Final Courses commenced in early 1990. Aptitude test/ Interviews were held on 18th March regarding 1990 First Year Course. Lectures will commence from April/May.

Education for Library and Information Studies has been undergoing exciting and dramatic changes over the last few years. The Education Committee stressed on

- * above all on a new perception


1989/90 was a difficult year mainly due to the unrest in our country. However we achieved a lot and could have achived more.
