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### Tsunami Devastates Libraries in Sri Lanka

The worst ever natural disaster experienced in Sri Lanka on Sunday December 26, 2004 affected the whole country in all aspects of activities. The tragic waves did not spare the libraries in the eastern and southern coast. It also affected the activities of other areas of the country indirectly. The whole nation was affected either directly or indirectly.

As everybody was engaged in providing the basic needs of the people who survived the situation, the need for libraries or rebuilding libraries were not a priority at the beginning. The Sri Lanka National Library and Documentatior. Services Board (NLDSB) made an early appeal on Tuesday, 28 December 2004, to the international library community making available information on damaged libraries. This received an instant response from UNESCO resulting in a visit of Dr. Susanne Ornager, Advisor, Information and Communication Division for Asia, UNESCO, New Delhi office. As a result of the UNESCO intervention, the Sri Lanka Disaster Management Committee for Library, Information Services and Archives (SL DMC-LISA ) attached to the NLDSB was set up at which the SLLA was represented very well.

As the one and only professional organisation in the field of LIS in Sri Lanka the Council of SLLA after visiting the affected libraries decided to develop few libraries as model libraries. The project was publicised and circulated among the membership. It was remarkable how some of the members tried their level best to get funding through different sources using their official and personal connections. As a result SLLA received funding from foreign as well as local sources. The team effort of the Council and the support of the non Council members should be noted with great appreciation. This event proved the capabilities of library professionals are not to be underestimated.

Although the SLLA had to deviate from its normal scheduled activities by involving themselves in the process of developing model libraries, this comes well within its mandate, being the only professional association in the field. In an era where librarians themselves were highly engaged in rebuilding their roles and changing the library's role the tsunami created a new challenge to the professionals. Rather than developing strategies for marketing and negotiating skills, they will be seen as a responsible authoritative figure in the process of redeveloping the community. This would be a good opportunity for the library professionals to make their presence felt by the decisions makers and the planners of the nations. SLLA with the support of its members shall be strong and is determined to make this possible.

#### INTRODUCTION

Libraries, information and knowledge environment has been and continues to be changed by the development of the communication technologies and the Internet. Since the mid-1990s there have been substantial efforts to develop practical technologies for library services. The development of networked information too has already brought significant changes in information-seeking behavior and library services. This has made possible to extend library services online to remote access points.

Technologically, we are approaching the point at which it will be possible to move our libraries out of their buildings and into the computers of scholars, teachers, and students everywhere.. This is not just the card catalogs, not just some digitized collections, not just leased e-journals, but massive quantities of books, manuscripts, and audiovisual resources that our libraries have painstakingly accumulated over decades, in support of scholarly research and education. Massive digitization for widespread online access can be achieved. Why not do it?

Massive digitization means making resources now available only within the walls of major research libraries, universally accessible. Digital library resources could flow freely across institutions and even across continents. This will reduce time-consuming, expensive trips for research to institutions outside a scholar's own. Resources available to teachers and students for course work of all kinds could be substantially increased.

To fall in line with these developments, we, as responsible professionals need to do our best to enhance our technical knowledge, improving skills and make a start to implement new systems within our own working units.

To support Librarians and information professionals in their futuristic endeavors, the Sri Lanka Library Association for the past several years has been making an effort in providing educational programmes, practical training and providing scholarly advice in these areas of timely interest. In addition, as a professional body the SLLA has been initiative in legally stabilizing the professional status of the professionals.

We gather for the 45th AGM with the deliberation of evaluating our activities and start on new projects and programmes that would improve our professionalism. With the assistance and guidance provided by the SLLA, hope that we can improve our libraries and collections by making use of the latest technology.

This annual report covers the period after the 44<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting held on 25 June 2004 and includes the year ending June 2005. It includes the activities during the period under review.

## 01. MEMBERSHIP

The active membership of SLLA at the end of May 2005 was 315. Five Corporate members (Associate members) and twenty two non-corporate members were enrolled during this year.

#### 05.02 Professional development programmes

#### 05.02.01 Seminar on Knowledge Management

SLLA organized a seminar on Knowledge Management and Digital Divide on 27<sup>th</sup> July 2004 at the Auditorium of Sri Lanka Institute of International Relations, Colombo. There were two presentations by Ms. Sue Henczel, Training and Consortia Manager, CAVAL Collaborative Solutions, Australia, on Knowledge Management and Dr. Abhijith Lahiri, Advisor, NISSAT, India on Digital Divide and Digital Library Development in India. About 30 participants attended the seminar.

#### 05.02.02. Regional Workshop on Web Cataloguing

A Regional Workshop on Web-cataloguing was organized with a UNESCO grant awarded to cover the expenses of the workshop and participants.

The main objective of the Workshop was to demonstrate advanced features of CDS/ISIS and to educate CDS/ISIS trainers how CDS/ISIS and associated software could be utilized to create web catalogues. It is envisaged that the participants would train the local librarians to create web catalogues.

#### 05.02.02.1 Organizing Committee

A Committee comprising of the following persons was appointed by SLLA to organize the Workshop:

#### 05.02.02.2 Participants

No participants were available from Maldives and Bhutan where CDS/ISIS software is not used. Hence geographical coverage was extended to cover two countries where CDS/ISIS was recently introduced by UNESCO. The countries included were: Bangladesh, Nepal, India, Pakistan, Myanmar, Laos and Sri Lanka.

Persons nominated and supported by local national library associations were given prominence in selection of participants. Only two persons from each country were selected, except from the host country Sri Lanka. Participants needed to have experience in cataloguing, data entry; library or office software. Knowledge in CDS/ISIS was essential while working experience in HTML was expected.

#### 05.02.02.3 Facilities:

A round-up air tickets, hotel accommodation, meal expenses and local transport were provided. Copying facilities, Internet and e-mail facilities were also available. Infopack with the UNESCO CD, workshop documents and some other professional materials were distributed.

#### 05.02.02.4 Workshop venue

The Workshop was held at the Sri Lanka Press Institute from 21 - 25 February. Computer centre of the SLPI was used for demonstrations, lectures and hands on practical. A network of 16 computers, multimedia projector, display/ projection screens were available. Restaurant of the SLPI was used to serve meals.

#### 05.02.02.5 Inauguration

Although the workshop started on 21 February, it was ceremonially inaugurated on 22

February at the Galle Face Hotel. About 100 library professionals and officials of LIS organizations attended. Dr Sussane Onager, Regional Adviser For Communication And Information In Asia And The Pacific, UNESCO, New Delhi, was the chief guest. Mrs. D. Talagala, President SLLA, Dr Onager and Mrs. G. Amarasekera, General Secretary SLLA addressed the meeting.

#### 05.02.02.6 Resource Persons

Resource persons were selected to handle different topics given in the programme. Following were the major areas of specialization:

- Information technology (in general), Library automation (general), windows operating system
- Compilation of databases using WINISIS
- Application of GENISIS software
- Web page design
- Linking the electronic catalogue to create the Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC).

#### 05.02.03 Regional Workshop on Integrating Information Skills into School Curriculum

Ms. Padma Bandaranayake was nominated for the Regional Workshop on Integrated Information Skills into School Curriculum held from 1-5 November 2004 at the Hotel Galadari Colombo. The workshop organised by NILIS and sponsored by IFLA included participants from South and South East Asian Countries and Ms. Bandaranayake represented the SLLA at the above workshop.

#### 05.02.04 UN4IM Training Programme

Two members were nominated for a UNESCO supported Innovative Training Programme - UN4IM held in Bangalore, India from May to December 2005. All expenses towards their participation would be borne by UNESCO. Two months, one in May and the other in December will be spent in India, and the other four months will be spent in Sri Lanka, as a distant programme. Ms. Padma Bandaranayake and Ms. Priyadharshani Hemakumara participated in the first month of the training.

#### 05.02.05. English for Public Librarians

English classes for Public Librarians were organised once a week. Colombo Public library staff was selected as the first batch as suggested by the CPD Committee. Due to poor response from the participants the classes had to be discontinued after three weeks. The Resource person was Ms. Nanda Wanasundera

05.03. Sri Lanka Library Association (Incorporation) (Amendment) Act, No. 7 of 2004 The Committee appointed at the last AGM held five meetings and concluded their suggestions for amending the Sri Lanka Library Association (Incorporation) (Amendment) Act, No. 7 of 2004 which came into effect from 06th February 2004. The suggested amendments will be sent to all the members for further suggestions and will be taken up for discussion at the AGM.

The list of Chartered Librarians was published in the Daily News on the 30<sup>th</sup> May, 2005 according to the Act and the Rules of SLLA.

#### 05.04 Service Minute of the Government Librarians

The President, Ms. Talagala was invited by the Ministry of Public Administration for a discussion on the Government Librarians' Service Minute. At this meeting the Director, Integrated Services of Public Administration accepted the suggestions made by SLLA and the National Library & Documentation Services Board to prepare the final version of the service minute.

The public Administration was also informed about the change of name of the DIPLIS Course, so that those who followed the course in the past will not be affected by this change of name.

#### 05.05. Representations at Governing Boards of other Institutes

The President, President elect, Treasurer and Past President represented SLLA at the Sri Lanka Disaster Management Committee for Library and Information Services and Archives (SLDMC for LISA)

#### 05.06 45th Annual General Meeting and Annual Sessions of SLLA

A Committee was appointed to organize the 45<sup>th</sup> AGM and Annual Sessions of SLLA. Annual Seminar "National Conference on Library and Information Studies" is organized to be held on the 29<sup>th</sup> June and AGM on the 30<sup>th</sup> June. The main objective of the annual conference was to provide an ideal forum to the library professionals and information providers to come together and interact on subjects of mutual interest, leading to the professional development of the members of the Association. Full papers will be distributed on a CD.

The Council decided to hold the AGM and NACLIS both on a low key due to the fact that SLLA funds were utilised for the Tsunami project. The Council also decided that when the country is facing a national crisis it was not appropriate to request for sponsorship from vendors.

#### 05.07 Tsunami Project of SLLA

According to statistics available, 52 public libraries, around 177 school libraries and 68 libraries attached to religious institutions were damaged or destroyed completely in the Northern, Eastern and Southern coastal belt of the country by the recent tsunami. As the only professional organization in the field of LIS in the country, the council of the Sri

Lanka Library Association were of the view that the Association should contribute in some measure towards the rebuilding and restoration of some of these libraries. Several members of the Association visited the affected areas, and after some discussion, decided to launch a project to rebuild four damaged libraries as model libraries. The libraries selected were:

- Lakshman Thabrew Memorial Public Library in Balapitiya
- Vidyaloka Vidyalaya School (Science ) Library in Galle
- Thambilivul Maha Vidyalaya English Library in Thirukkovil, Ampara
- Batticaloa Public Library (children's library), Batticaloa

Estimates for rebuilding have been already obtained. Donations of books have been received and also pledged, and equipment requirements are being looked into presently. Assistance was solicited from members, non members and other library associations. The SLLA greatly acknowledges the contributions received and the efforts of the members who initiated in getting donations. These are listed in *Annexe* 5.

#### 5.08 Vision and Mission of SLLA

The Publications and Public Relations Committee of the SLLA submitted a draft Vision and Mission Statement to be adopted by the Council. This was further modified and adopted. It was published in the Newsletter of March 2005.

#### 5.09 Developing Reading Skills of A. L. Students

A one day lecture programme on "How do We use a library and develop reading skills" for Advanced Level students of the National school, R/Jeilani Central College at Balangoda was conducted on 11<sup>th</sup> May 2005. This was organized to meet their requirements for an assignment on Rebuilidng a school library at a national level, and to promote their reading habit using a library. The programme also included a visit to the University Museum, Central Library and the book binding section.

Mrs. T.N. Neighsoorei, the representative for Sabaragamuwa Region coordinated programme. She was also awarded a plaque for consultation services rendered to the Library of Military Academy at Diyatalawa, on 12 –13 February 2005.

#### 5.10 Directory on Special Libraries

The Special Library Group is in the process of preparing a directory of special libraries. A questionnaire will be used to collect data.

#### 5.11 Enhancement of SLLA Resources

SLLA purchased a spiral binder and a paper cutter, to enhance the SLLA office facilities. These will greatly assist in the education programme. A laptop computer to be used during workshops and seminars was also purchased.

#### 06.03. Empowering Library Associations for effective Management

A Workshop by IFLA's / ALP and the Nepal Library Association

Mr. Nallathamby was invited to present a paper 'Financial management in Library Association' at the above workshop, which was held from 5-8, 2004 in Nepal. Mr. Yapa also attended the workshop as a participant.

One of the resolutions moved at the workshop was setting up a regional federation of library associations in South Asia. After the meeting the representatives from the library associations in Asia met and discussed about a formation of a federation. It was decided to form The Regional Federation on South Asian Library Associations (REFSALA). A planning committee comprising Mr. Bola, Mr. Bandari (Nepal) Dr. Abdussatar (Bangladesh), Mr. Ejaz (Pakistan), Mr. Muttayyah, Ms. Kalpana (India), Mr. Yapa, Nallathamby (Sri Lanka), Prof. Bowden (IFLA) prepared a draft constitution of REFSALA. The first meeting of REFSALA is scheduled to be held in July in Nepal.

#### 06.04 UNESCO/ APIN 2nd Meeting

Ms. Warnasuriya, President Elect attended the above meeting on the invitation from Institute of Scientific and Technical of Information of China (ISTIC) / UNESCO. The meeting was held in China and air fare and accommodation was provided by ISTIC. Dr.Susan Orneger, Advisor for Communications and Information in Asia, UNESCO was the main official at this session. Some of the topics covered included the Information for all Programme, Grants for such projects, and the constitution and working of APIN. Very informative papers on the World Summit on the Information Society was presented by Dr. Yves Courier from UNESCO, and Awareness raising on information literacy by Dr. Shalini Urs from Mysore.

Ms. Warnasuriya had the opportunity to discuss with Dr.Ornager about the Web Cataloguing Workshop, which was held in Sri Lanka.

#### 06.05 Clodagh Nethsinghe Memorial Library - Institute of Chemistry

The SLLA council donated a Library Counter worth of Rs. 30,000.00 to the Clodagh Nethsingha Library of the Institute of Chemistry The counter will have a label indicating that it was donated by the SLLA. The President was also invited as the Guest of Honour at the opening ceremony of this library.

Publications Committee published four Newsletters for the period ending June 2005 and the SLLA Journal "Sri Lanka Library Review' Volume 19.

### 08. FINANCIAL REPORT -2004/2005

#### FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31<sup>st</sup> MARCH 2005

7/3,306/=The Sri Lanka Library Association recorded an income of Rs. 135,007/= for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2005 when compared with last year shows a significant decrease. The major contributing factor for the last years profit was the income from DEPLIS which was around Rs. 2.7 Million.

3.2.

There has been a drop in the income from course fees and Examination fees. This is due to fact that the course fee on Level 2 Part 1 was not received in full during the financial year. Most of the payments were received in April/May 2005. Also the course on Library Automation has not yet commenced and the full fee has not been received in the financial year.

The administration expenses have increased from 1.9 M in the previous year to Rs. 2.7 M in the current year. This is mainly due to the charge of Rs. 300,000/= in the Donations account which was set a side for Tsunami Library rebuilding project. The depreciation charges have also increased in the current year due to additions of Fixed assets.

Fixed assets were purchased to the value of Rs. 806,300/= during financial year. A digital copy printer, 2 computers, Lap Top computer, 22 Nos computer chairs, Paper cutter and a paper binder were the assets purchased.

Rs. 1 Million was invested in fixed deposits during the year under review.

Rs. 851,278/= is available in the Library Re building Fund which includes the contribution of Rs. 300,000/=, made by the Sri Lanka Library Association. This will be used to develop Libraries in the Galle, Batticaloa and Ampara districts.

The Auditors report for the 2004/2005 is given in Annex 06.
