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Preface

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The Annual Report 2008/2009 covers the activities carried out by the Sri Lanka Library Association for the period starting from June 25, 2008, the day the 48th Annual General Meeting was held last year and the new office bearers appointed, to the year ending on June 24, 2009.

This year has been yet another busy year for the SLLA, with the educational programmes, seminars and workshops and other professional activities being carried out as usual. A draft plan of the proposed building in the land acquired on lease, at Depanama, Pannipitiya was prepared. Building Committee has launched several programmes to raise funds for the Building Project. Steps also have been taken to get the SLLA exempted from all income taxes. An international workshop was organized in collaboration with the National Library and Documentation Services Board (NLDSB) to train the leaders in library profession and the professionals in Regional Association for South Asian Library Associations (REFSALA) and other stakeholders with the financial support from the IFLA's Action through Development of Libraries Programme(ALP). Follow up workshop was also held at Badulla and few more similar workshops have been planned. It is gratifying to note that within the reviewed year the Association focused more on public library sector and was able to rekindle the enthusiasm of many public librarians.

Few meetings were held with the officials of the Ministry of Public Administration regarding Government Librarians Service Minute. It is regrettable to note that the officers concerned have not completed the task yet. However, in order to reactivate promotional prospects of Government Librarians, the Ministry is likely to implement provisions of the previous service minute, until such time a new service minute is completed. It is to be noted that professional grievances of many librarians have been successfully dealt with the relevant authorities.

Gaining full recognition to the library profession in a country where the importance of libraries has not yet fully comprehended by authorities is indeed a massive task. The constant commitment of all is needed to achieve the goals. SLLA means all of us; the library and information profession. Hence, let us speak up together for our profession and our life blood to achieve our targets.

The members of the Council, Executive Committee, various groups and committees and the office staff did their best to make all the activities of the SLLA fruitful and successful. Being the sole professional body devoted to Library and Information Science in Sri Lanka, prime duty of SLLA is to develop the profession. We encourage the participation of the entire membership and the office bearers of the Association in all its activities, since it is a challenging task yet to be achieved.

01. Membership

The membership of the SLLA as at June 10, 2009 was 392. This includes 243 Corporate and 149 Non-Corporate members. At the time this report was going the print, 07 applications for Associateship and 03 applications for Fellowship were approved by the Council. The applicants will be awarded Associateship and Fellowship respectively at the forth coming 49th AGM.

The number of Non-corporate members enrolled during the year is 27. The list of non-corporate members enrolled this year and the lists of members eligible for Fellowship and Associateship are given in **Annex 01**.

Level I Course and Workshop

The DEPLIS Level 1 (postal) Course commenced in March 2009. 41 students were enrolled and the course will continue till December 2009. Three workshops and one day revision seminar will be held for the students in June, September, and December 2009 respectively.

05.01.06 Seminars and Workshops

Seminars for the students

A total number of three revision seminars were held during the period. These seminars had a favourable and interactive participation from both the students as well as the lecturers.

Workshops for SLLA Lecturers

"Training of Trainers (TOT) Workshop on 'Effective Teaching and Guiding Methods in LIS Education for the SLLA Lecturers of the DIPLIS programme at all levels (I, II and III)"

The above workshop was held on 7th February 2009 in collaboration with the National Library and Documentation Services Board and the Sri Lanka Library Association. The Chief Guest of this event was Mr. E.A. Samarasinghe, Chairman of the NLDSB. Lecture modules discussed were the preparation of training programmes, quality and standards of SLLA education programme, Andragogy, (Teaching Adults), effective teaching and guiding the students, methodologies and techniques and lesson planning. Objectives of the workshop were to convene all SLLA lecturers to a round table discussion, to discuss and make aware how to learn, teach and guide LIS students in a less privileged environment. Prof. P. Ranasinghe, President of the SLLA, Emeritus Prof. of Education Ms. C. Gunawardena, and Prof. Ms D. Lekamge, Dean, Faculty of Education, Open University of Sri Lanka were the resource persons of the workshop.

05.01.07 Newly Introduced Projects and Programmes

1. Appointment of Subject Coordinators

Six subject groups have been identified consisting of all lecturers who are teaching at different Study Centres at SLLA. These subject groups are 1. Librararianship, Library Resources and Services (LLRS), 2.

Cataloguing, 3. Classification, 4. Indexing, 5. IT and 6. Management The main purpose of appointing Subject Coordinators (SC) is to safeguard the quality and improvement of DIPLIS programmes. The Subject Coordinators are 1. Cataloguing - Mr. N.U. Yapa, 2. Classification - Mr. G.R.Padmasiri, 3. Indexing - Mr. N.U. Yapa, 4. Management - Mrs. Padma Bandaranáyke, 5. IT - Mrs. Deepali Talagala and 6. LLRS- Mrs. Swarna Jayatilake. Terms of reference for each of the above subject group leaders are 1. To give the leadership for syllabus revision in the subject, 2. To take steps for maintaining the uniformity and standards in teaching and guiding the subject at different Study Centres (SLLA) i.e. conducting of subject related workshops for SLLA Lecturers. 3. Assist the Education Officer (EO) for paper setting and moderation of question papers relevant to the subject when a request is made by the (EO). 4. Giving suggestions for improving teaching methods, curriculum development in the subject or any other proposal whichever that improves the quality, standards and usage of the subject. 5. To serve as the subject matter specialist on the subject/s. 6. To serve as the leader/head of subject group in the above subject. 7. To build friendship and mutual cooperation with fellow lecturers in the subject at different study centres through email, phone etc.

2. Opening of Teaching Libraries

It was decided to open Teaching Libraries (TL) at different study centres at SLLA. The nearest public library to individual centre has been identified as the best place for locating the Teaching Library. The objective of this TL is to collect library and information science books and reference materials for the use of SLLA students. Initially, the Education Officer donated two sets of library science books to Kandy and Badulla centres. NLDSB donated basic reference sources to the library.

3. Subject Refresher Workshops

Education Committee feels that the value of introducing sandwich type of workshops for improving the knowledge and competence of SLLA lecturers in their individual teaching areas. The principal subject areas identified under this programme are given in above para no.1. The first refresher workshop was held on Cataloguing under the theme of "Solving cataloguing problems and achieving consistency in teaching" on 25 January 2009. The resource person was Mr. N.U. Yapa.

4. Curriculum Development Committee (CDC)

The Education Committee decided to establish a "Curriculum Development Committee (CDC) as a sub-committee of the Education Committee of the SLLA to look into overall curriculum revision.

Publications

The student guide book for DIPLIS Level 111 titled "Sahithya Gavesanaya" compiled by Dr. Mrs. Indra Ranasinghe was revised and published.

Future Plans and Programmes

1. Conduct series of workshops for training of SLLA lecturers on classification, indexing, abstracting, human resource management, marketing management, management of information systems, leadership, information literacy and digital libraries etc.

2. Maintain an online database for SLLA lecturers. The purpose of this database is to facilitate interpersonal communication as and when professional contacts are needed.

3. It is expected to publish following two guide books.

i. "Literature Survey" translated into English by Mr. K.G.G. Wijeweera. (Its original publication in Sinhala is "Sahithya Gavesanaya" which is mentioned above.)

ii. "Cataloguing Work Examples" compiled by Mr. N.U. Yapa for the students DIPLIS Level 1.

4. It is intended to develop professional qualities and norms system for the SLLA lecturers with the help of them.

05.02 Professional Development Programmes

05.02.01 Workshop on Sinhala Unicode implementation for Libraries

With collaboration of Silpasayura/Nenasala Team lead by Mr. Niranjan Meegammana, Proprietor – Efusion, the IT and Continuous Professional Development (CPD) Committees organized a one day workshop on "Sinhala Unicode implementation for Libraries" on 03 December 2008 at the SLLA Computer Laboratory for our members of IT and Education Committees of SLLA. A CD and an e-manual on Sinhala Unicode were distributed among the participants. The organizers were looking forward to reorganize the programme for other committees, but were unable to do so due to practical reasons, including the low response from the membership.

05.02.02 Workshop on Information Security Awareness

The Special Librarians group of the Sri Lanka Library Association organized a workshop on Information Security Awareness. The target groups of this workshop were Librarians and other personnel engaged in handling information. This one day workshop was held at the Samudra Hotel of the Sri Lanka Institute of Tourism & Hotel Management, No 78, Galle Road, Colombo 03 on 16 January 2009.

The workshop resource persons were highly qualified professionals attached to the Information Security Division of Sri Lanka Telecom. The financial sponsorship was offered by the Expographic Books (Private) Ltd and Sri Lanka Institute of Information Technology (SLIIT).

Workshop was highly successful and 57 persons including librarians and others handle information participated in it. Out of the income of the workshop, the committee was able to make a contribution of Rs. 77,244.60 towards the building fund of the SLLA. Convener of this committee is Ms. Pushpamala Perera.

05.02.03 Awareness Programme on Drugs Prevention

On January 29, 2009, the SLLA NGO group in collaboration with the National Dangerous Drugs Control Board (NDDCB) and American Center conducted an awareness program on Drug Prevention at the American Center Auditorium which linked with the American Corner in Male, Republic of Maldives via Digital Video Conference.

presentations NDDCB made Two counselors from the on "classification of prevalent abusing drugs; factors affecting the attraction of drugs and prevention strategies" and discussed issues from Non-Governmental with participants. Representatives Organizations working actively in drug prevention activities in both countries attended the program. There were about 25 participants in Sri Lanka and 10 participants in Maldives. Convener of this awareness programme is Ms. Deepali Talagala.

05.02.04 Workshop to train Library Association Leaders and Professionals in Regional Federation of South Asian Library Associations (REFSALA) on Library Advocacy and Policy Development

SLLA in collaboration with the National Library and Documentation Services Board of Sri Lanka (NLSDB) organized the above workshop on the 12th and 13th February 2009, at Hotel Renuka, Colombo to train Library Association Leaders and professionals of REFSALA on Library Advocacy and Policy Development. A series of provincial workshops on the theme are also scheduled to be held before the end of the year.

The workshop was fully funded by the Action for Development through Libraries (ALP) programme of International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA). The chief resource persons were Ms. Moira Fraser, Parliament Librarian, New Zealand and Mr. Michael Dowling, International Relations Officer of American Library Association. They were assisted by Prof. P. Ranasinghe, President, SLLA, Mr. Bola Sheshthra, President, REFSALA, Nepal and Mr. D.V. Singh, Indian Library Association. Dr. (Mrs.) Wathmanel Seneviratne was fully involved in this workshop for two days facilitating the English/Sinhala communication. There were 63 participants and the workshop was very successful. Full report of the workshop is available at the SLLA Office.

The first provincial workshop was held at Uva Provincial Library Services Board at Badulla in collaboration with Budulla Municipality and Uva Provincial Library Services Board. This two day workshop was attended by 33 participants. Resource persons were Ms. Premila Gamage, Mr. P.B. Gallaba, Ms. Janaki Fernando, Mr. Uditha Alahakoon and Mr. Upali Gunasekara.

05.02.05 National Library Seminars in eight schools

Mr. P.B. Gallaba and Mr.J. Rathnayake represented SLLA at the above seminar in Hambanthota. Prof. Piyadasa Ranasinghe represented the seminar at Anuradhapura. These seminars were organized by the National Library and Documentation Services Board.

05.02.06 Project to conduct career guidance services for school students in 18 districts

OPA organized workshops in collaboration with SLLA in Colombo and Gampaha District Centres. Mr. P.B. Gallaba and Mr. G.R. Padmasiri participated as resource persons.

05.02.07 Two day Programme on Public Relations of Information Leaders and Librarians

Social Affairs committee organized a two day residential programme on Public Relations of Information Leaders and Librarians from 05 to 06 June 2008. This successful programme held at NIETSL Auditorium, Ratmalana, was attended by eighty six (86) SLLA members.

05.03 National Conference on Library and Information Studies (NACLIS) 2009

This year too, the annual conference of the SLLA, the National Conference on Library and Information Studies (NACLIS) 2009 was organized as a separate event and it will be held on June 25, 2009 at the Hotel Taj Samudra, Colombo. Emeritus Professor Chandra Gunawardene will be the Chief Guest In addition to the presentation of papers there will be a dialog forum on Access to Knowledge too. For the first time in NACLIS history a volume of conference proceedings will also be printed and published. Dr. Mrs. Wathmanel Seneviratne is the convener of the Conference.

This year's theme for the conference is "Access to knowledge (A2K) through Information Management".

05.04 National Reading Month Activities

SLLA worked in collaboration with National Library and Documentation Services Board in the National Reading Month programmes. In the first programme held at Hambantota SLLA was represented by P. B. Gallaba, the President Elect and Mr. J. Rathnayake info/Public Relations Officer, while the final programme held at Anuardhapura was represented by Prof. Piyadasa Ranasinghe, the President. In addition, SLLA organized several workshops and seminars for Reading Month in Colombo, Monaragala, Bandarawela and Gampola.

05.05 Sri Lanka Library Association (Incorporation) Act

Two meetings were held at the Legal Draftsman's Office in order to finalize the amendments to SLLA Act No. 7 of 2004. Further action will be taken by the Legal Draftsman's Office in this regard.

05.06 Tsunami Project of SLLA

Libraries from Southern Province(Andaragasyaya Primary School, Kosgoda Public Library, Vidyaloka School Library, Rathgama Siri Sumana Vidyalaya Primary School Library, Childrens' Library of Sudharma Vidyalaya Galle and two libraries from Eastern Province (Batticaloa Public Library & Thambiluville School Library) come under this Project.

To commemorate the "Literature Month" a ceremony was organized on our request by the Teacher Librarian and the staff on 23rd of September, 2008. This was held at the School Auditorium.

Following competitions were and events were held and prizes were awarded to the winners;

• Three Essay Competitions among children in Grades, 3-5 (nine prizes)

• A girl student and a boy student who used the library more frequently (two prizes)

• Two dancing items by two children

SLLA was represented by President–Elect Mr. P.B. Gallaba, Co-Coordinators of the Tsunami Committee and a few Librarians from the Galle area. The Principal, the Staff members and children of the primary section too participated in the function. This event went on successfully and the children were very happy.

A set of books worth over Rs 25,000/ were also handed over to the Library for the use of children of the school.

On the same day SLLA council members visited a number of schools in Galle District distributed books donated by UK via British Council. Public Libraries in Kosgoda, Galle and Baddegama and School Libraries in Sudharma Vidyalaya, Vidyaloka Vidyalaya and Ginimellagaha Pradeshiya Sabha Library are among them. During the course of year 2008 the Andaragasyaya Primary School also conducted several activities;

- 3 Art Exhibitions
- 1 Literacy workshop for teachers
- Art Exhibition and a concert at Saraswathi Hall, Debaragaswewa National School

Art exhibition was conducted by prominent artists such as Colvin Settinayake, Shantha K. Herath and Shyamala Vidanagama. The concert was organized with the help of Mrs. F. Pallie, who is an experienced primary teacher. Prof. Piyadasa Ranasinghe, Uditha Alahakoon and Ven. Mawarala Bhaddiya Thero served as resource persons at the literacy workshop for teachers and parents of the students. This was arranged on request made by the Principal.

For the first time the children of the school performed in an auditorium. The parents, Directors of Education and few members of SLLA Council were present at the concert. The Directors of Education highly appreciated the effort of the SLLA and was amazed by the performing abilities of the young children.

The art exhibition too was very successful as there were many good drawings by the children. With this the SLLA concluded its project. However, monitoring activities of the SLLA will go on for a further period.

A DVD was produced on the concert and the exhibition was sent to donors.

A volunteer teacher who is in charge of the library has successfully completed the SLLA's Part 1 of Library & Information Science Diploma Course and now following Part 2. She will be paid by an incentive for another few years with the project funds. Mr. Michael Dowling of ALA who is one of the major donors visited Andaragasyaya Library in February and extremely happy with the work done and highly appreciated the SLLA's efforts.

It was not possible to visit the Eastern Province schools due to various reasons.

All activities of Tsunami Project were handled through the involvement of Ms. Premila Gamage. Ms. D.I.D. Andradi & Ms. Swama Jayathilake are the Co-Conveners of the Tsunami Project.

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05.07 Other Activities

05.07.01 Trainings and Jobs

As usual, SLLA assisted students in finding training and employment in various institutes.

05.07.02 Professional Problems

In response to a number of grievances made by members in relation to their professional problems, the SLLA communicated and dealt with the relevant authorities. It is to be noted here that some of the problems could be solved in this manner.

Committee on Information and Public Relations is revising and updating the membership database. Compilation of a comprehensive list of e-mail addresses and telephone numbers of all SLLA members is also in progress.

05.07.03 E-mail Group

An e-mail group of council members was created to facilitate effective communication among members.

05.07.04 Annual Excursion

Social Affairs Committee organized the Annual Excursion on 02 May 2009. The venue was Historical Ritigala Mountain. Thirty seven (37) members of the SLLA participated in the excursion. Mr. R.D. Anandatissa was the organizer of the event.

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05.07.05 Poster Competition

Education and School Libraries Group organized a poster competition among school libraries of the members. Ms. Priyani Balasuriya is the convener of this group.

06 Land and the Building Project

The major task to be accomplished by the Association is the construction of a suitable building for SLLA training programmes. A draft plan was prepared by the committee. Mr. Lionel Amarakoon with the support of the team prepared a detailed "SLLA fund raising strategy paper" on behalf of the Building Committee, which was approved by the council for implementation in the coming year. Steps

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have been taken to get the building fund exempted from income tax. The following Committee has donated money to the building fund.

Special Librarians Group ~ Rs. 77,244.60 – This amount has to be transferred to building fund.

At present the total collection in the building fund is Rs. 77,050.98. A number of activities have been proposed for fund raising. Some proposals are now being implemented.

07. Publications and Publicity

07.01. SLLA Newsletter- Vol. 23/24 No.1 to 4 -2008/2009

During the period under review, three issues of the SLLA Newsletter (V0I. 23-24 N0s 1-4) were published and distributed among the SLLA members.

Fairly wide publicity was given in this year to SLLA activities, such as educational matters, achievements, new centers, seminars and workshops etc. through media as well as seminars and meetings held at various places.

07.02 Sri Lanka Library Review: Vol.23 June 2009

Action is being taken to release the Sri Lanka Library Review at the forthcoming 49th Annual General Meeting 2009 of the Sri Lanka Library Association. Articles written in English, Tamil and Sinhala will be included in the Journal.

During the relevant period, four meetings were held to discuss the contents of the Newsletters and the Journal, advertisements etc. and the recommendations of the committee were referred to the Council for approval before implementation.

The convener, Mrs. Swarna Jayatilake and the members of the Publications & Publicity Committee wish to thank the Council members, those who submitted articles for publication in the Journal, the Advertisers and Contributors and the SLLA staff, for their co-operation, support and assistance in this regard.

07.03 TV/Radio Programmes

Committee on Information and Public Relations organized TV programmes in Rupavahini channel related to the professional events and AGM of the SLLA. NSB sponsored 10 minute radio programme on 20 June 2009 regarding AGM.

07.04 SLLA Website

SLLA website was updated by its convener Ms. Deepali Talagala. For the publicity of the International Conference Dr. Ruwan Gamage of IT Committee created a separate web page through ULA website.

07.05 Publicity for AGM

Ms. Mangalika Gunathilake took steps to publicize the event as follows:

Specially, the collaboration between Sri Lanka National Library and Documentation Services Board, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kelaniva and National Institute of Library and Information Science (NILIS) are to be highlighted.

During the period Ms. Premila Gamage represented SLLA as Governing Board Member of IFLA and as the Chairperson of the Regional Standing Committee of Asia and Oceania (RASCO).

President, Prof. P. Ranasinghe represented Committee on Management of Library Associations.

Vice President Mr. J.A.Amaraweera attended five Committee meetings of the IFAP / UNESCO (Information for all programmes) held at the NSF, representing SLLA during the year.

Mr. Amaraweera also participated in the Asia-Pacific Networking Group (APNG) activities as an Executive Committee Member and the chair of its Internet History Museum Group (IHM) and to the 10th Anniversary APNG Camp held at the AIT, Bangkok, Thailand from 10th to 15th July, 2008.

General Secretary, Mr. K.G.G. Wijeweera made a presentation on the Sri Lanka Library Association at the Executive Council Meeting of the OPA on 19 February 2009 as per their invitation.

09 Felicitations

The Council takes pleasure in announcing that Prof. Piyadasa Ranasinghe, was awarded Vice Chancellor's award on "Most outstanding Promoter of International Relations" on behalf of the Research Centre for Social Sciences (RCSS), Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Kelaniya. This was awarded in recognition of his services as the coordinator of the First International Conference on Social Sciences organized by the University.

The Council also takes pleasure in announcing the felicitations made by the National Library and Documentation Services Board on 15 May 2009 to Prof. Jayasiri Lankage, Prof. W.B. Dorakumbura, Mrs. Ishvari Corea and Mr. N. Amarasinghe, All are SLLA members and doyen library professionals in Sri Lanka.

10 Financial Report 2008/2009

The year under review recorded an income of Rs. 605,810/- compared with that of Rs. 1,433,344/- for the previous year. This decrease is due to the fact that it was not possible to start the educational courses and conducting the examinations during the financial year (2009) as there was a delay in starting the courses in 2008.

The income from workshops is Rs. 495,000/- and it is a slight increase when compared to that of in the previous year's income, Rs. 336,400/.

The interest income earned from fixed deposits amounted Rs. 1,119,443/- as against Rs. 885,912/- in last year.

Rs. 88,000/- was spent to purchase PC components which comes under fixed assets.

The administrative expenses during this period is Rs. 3,522,982/which is more or less the same when compared to last year's Rs. 3,471,044/-.

The cash and Bank balances of the Association (excluding Tsunami account and DEPP account) amounts to Rs. 13,556,045/-, compared to that of Rs. 11,199,523/- in the previous year.

Funds received for the proposed new building at Depanama, Pannipitiya is Rs. 46,200/ which is accumulated with the Rs. 30,850/which was brought forward since last year. The full amount currently in the fund is Rs. 77,050/-.

Main income of the Association is from the interest generated from savings and fixed deposits.

Auditors report for the year 2008/2009 is given as Annex 4.

11 SLLA Office Staff

With the resignation of Ms. T. Ranasinghe, Office Assistant on 16 July 2008, the total number of SLLA Office staff is five (05) at present.

Ms. V.S.N.de Alwis is the Administrative Secretary and Ms. E.M. de Silva is the Senior Accounts Assistant. Ms. K. Morawaka is the Office Assistant and Ms. J.S.P. de Silva is the Office Assistant cum Library Assistant. Mr. U. Perera is the Office Aide. This year too, the Office staff was paid incentives in April 2009, equivalent to their basic salary in appreciation of their dedicated service to the SLLA.

Ms. H.A. Karunatilake, an NAB trainee was assigned urgent work at SLLA Office for a period on one month from 18 May 2009 on casual basis.

We also announce with deep regret the passing away of Mr. P.A. Piyasena, a founder as well as life member of SLLA. He had served as a lecturer of SLLA.
